Why? (Short and Sweet)

- Hunting is a vital aspect our lives and our community
- Significant contributor to our economy
- A bigger issue on a state and national scale

The Math

- 950 hunters accessed the property last year
- 4500 recreational days for hunting
- \$50 per-recreation day = \$225,000
- Numbers are conservative estimates based on CPW Stats and input from local officers

History

- ▶ 1980 land sell. Stipulated that properties known as the Girls Claims be open for 25 years.
- ▶ 2005 the land was set to close
- Shell Lease 10 years agreement
- EnCana was always shaky, but stayed open

Where we are today...

- On line we have had 450 members join
- Survey has been taken by over 320
- Letter of support from county commissioners
- Over 50 community members attended the public meeting in support of retaining access
